AIUHS can deliver your graduation documents with a certificate called **APOSTILLE**. The Apostille of the Haya is a procedure of legalizing documents to effectively verify the authenticity of a document internationally. Physically, it consists of one page that is added to notarized documents that the Secretary of State stamps on to legalize the document.

The Haya Convention

This certification comes from the Convention of the Haya that took place on October 5, 1961, also known as the Convention of the Apostille, signed in the Haya, Netherlands. It suppresses the requirement of the legalization of foreign documents in consulates or embassies. It went into effect on January 24, 1965. The apostille has validity in countries that signed the convention, for which if the country where the Diploma wants to be used does not belong to the Convention, then it will be necessary a diplomatic legalization.

We strongly recommend our students to verify in their countries the institution's requirements where the diploma will be used.
